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OPEN HEAVEN 2 JUNE 2025 TODAY DEVOTIONAL

TOPIC: A NEW SONG

MEMORISE:

And he hath put a new song in my mouth, even praise unto our God: many shall see it, and fear, and shall trust in the LORD.

Psalms 40:3

READ: Exodus 15:1-21

1 Then sang Moses and the children of Israel this song unto the Lord, and spake, saying, I will sing unto the Lord, for he hath triumphed gloriously: the horse and his rider hath he thrown into the sea.

2 The Lord is my strength and song, and he is become my salvation: he is my God, and I will prepare him an habitation; my father's God, and I will exalt him.

3 The Lord is a man of war: the Lord is his name.

4 Pharaoh's chariots and his host hath he cast into the sea: his chosen captains also are drowned in the Red sea.

5 The depths have covered them: they sank into the bottom as a stone.

6 Thy right hand, O Lord, is become glorious in power: thy right hand, O Lord, hath dashed in pieces the enemy.

7 And in the greatness of thine excellency thou hast overthrown them that rose up against thee: thou sentest forth thy wrath, which consumed them as stubble.

8 And with the blast of thy nostrils the waters were gathered together, the floods stood upright as an heap, and the depths were congealed in the heart of the sea.

9 The enemy said, I will pursue, I will overtake, I will divide the spoil; my lust shall be satisfied upon them; I will draw my sword, my hand shall destroy them.

10 Thou didst blow with thy wind, the sea covered them: they sank as lead in the mighty waters.

11 Who is like unto thee, O Lord, among the gods? who is like thee, glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders?

12 Thou stretchedst out thy right hand, the earth swallowed them.

13 Thou in thy mercy hast led forth the people which thou hast redeemed: thou hast guided them in thy strength unto thy holy habitation.

14 The people shall hear, and be afraid: sorrow shall take hold on the inhabitants of Palestina.

15 Then the dukes of Edom shall be amazed; the mighty men of Moab, trembling shall take hold upon them; all the inhabitants of Canaan shall melt away.

16 Fear and dread shall fall upon them; by the greatness of thine arm they shall be as still as a stone; till thy people pass over, O Lord, till the people pass over, which thou hast purchased.

17 Thou shalt bring them in, and plant them in the mountain of thine inheritance, in the place, O Lord, which thou hast made for thee to dwell in, in the Sanctuary, O Lord, which thy hands have established.

18 The Lord shall reign for ever and ever.

19 For the horse of Pharaoh went in with his chariots and with his horsemen into the sea, and the Lord brought again the waters of the sea upon them; but the children of Israel went on dry land in the midst of the sea.

20 And Miriam the prophetess, the sister of Aaron, took a timbrel in her hand; and all the women went out after her with timbrels and with dances.

21 And Miriam answered them, Sing ye to the Lord, for he hath triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider hath he thrown into the sea.

RCCG OPEN HEAVEN 2 JUNE 2025 TODAY MESSAGE

A young fellow once gained admission into a university abroad and celebrated with his friends and family. However, during the celebration, one of his father's enemies said to himself, "This boy is going abroad; if he succeeds over there, he will return and buy his father a car. I will give him something to carry along that will ensure that he fails," so he diabolically inflicted the boy with a strange ailment. The boy got to his school and began to feel a terrible pain in his body. Doctors examined him thoroughly and could not diagnose what was wrong with him.

After six years of living in pain, he returned to Nigeria and attended one of our programmes that was held at Ibadan Grammar School. While I was ministering, the power of God hit him, and the pain disappeared. He started shouting, "It is gone!" God gave him a new song after six years of torment,

and He can do the same for everyone who cries out to Him in faith (Romans 10:11-13).

In 1994, the RCCG held a programme in Lagos tagged 'The Battle of the gods'. A man who attended the programme was suffering from four killer diseases: hypertension, diabetes, meningitis, and a heart problem. His doctors had advised him to travel abroad, and while planning to do so, he decided to come for the programme. The power of the Almighty God touched him; he was healed of all four diseases and was given a new song.

When the LORD turned again the captivity of Zion...Then was our mouth filled with laughter, and our tongue with singing... Psalm 126:1-2

One of the proofs that God has turned around people's captivity is that their tongues will be filled with songs of joy. New songs always accompany deliverance, salvation, and miracles.

In today's Bible reading, after the Israelites crossed the Red Sea and watched their enemies drown, they sang a new song to God. Moses and Miriam composed new songs, and everyone sang along to praise God for His wonderful miracles. Deborah also sang a new song after God gave them victory over Sisera and Jabin, the king of the Canaanites (Judges 5:1-31). Hannah was another person who received a new song from the Lord after she birthed Samuel (1 Samuel 2:1-10). I pray that the Lord will fill your mouth with songs of joy and laughter and give every member of your family new songs before the end of this year, in Jesus' name.

PRAYER POINT:

Lord, please fill my mouth with new songs of Your goodness and mercy, in Jesus' name.

The Power of a New Song

A *new song* in the Bible symbolizes divine intervention—deliverance from suffering, victory over enemies, and breakthrough after long periods of waiting. When God steps into a situation, He replaces sorrow with joy, pain with praise, and defeat with triumph.

Testimonies of Divine Intervention

The devotional shares two powerful testimonies:

1. The Young Man with a Strange Ailment

- After gaining admission abroad, an enemy afflicted him with an undiagnosable sickness.
- For **six years**, he suffered until he encountered God's power in a service.
- Instantly, the pain vanished, and he received his *new song* of deliverance.

2. The Man with Four Killer Diseases

- Diagnosed with **hypertension, diabetes, meningitis, and a heart condition**, doctors advised him to seek treatment abroad.
- Before traveling, he attended an RCCG program ("Battle of the Gods") and was **completely healed**—receiving a new song of testimony.

Lesson: No situation is beyond God's power. Whether it's spiritual attacks, sickness, or prolonged suffering, God can break every chain and give you a new song.

Biblical Examples of New Songs

1. Israel at the Red Sea (Exodus 15:1-21)

- After their miraculous deliverance from Pharaoh's army, Moses and Miriam led the Israelites in a *new song* of victory.

2. Deborah's Song of Victory (Judges 5:1-31)

- When God defeated Sisera and the Canaanites, Deborah and Barak sang a triumphant new song.

3. Hannah's Song of Joy (1 Samuel 2:1-10)

- After years of barrenness, Hannah gave birth to Samuel and sang a prophetic song of praise.

Key Insight:

- A *new song* is not just literal—it represents a **transformed life**.
- It means **God has turned your mourning into dancing** (Psalm 30:11).

How to Receive Your New Song

1. Cry Out to God in Faith (Romans 10:11-13)

- Like the young man in the testimony, desperation and faith attract divine intervention.

2. Position Yourself for a Miracle

- The sick man attended a program where God's power was present. **Be where God is moving!**

3. Praise in Advance

- The Israelites sang *after* their victory, but sometimes, praise **precedes** the breakthrough (Acts 16:25-26).

4. Testify of God's Goodness

- Your new song is not just for you—it inspires others to trust God (Psalm 40:3).

Prayer Point

“Father, give me a new song! Turn every pain into praise, every struggle into a testimony. Let my life declare Your glory, in Jesus’ name. Amen.”

Conclusion

God specializes in rewriting stories. Just as He gave the Israelites, Deborah, and Hannah new songs, He can replace your sorrow with **unspeakable joy** (1 Peter 1:8). Your season of singing is here!

Key Takeaways for Personal Reflection:

No suffering is permanent. God can end years of pain suddenly.

Divine healing is real. Trust God beyond medical reports.

Your testimony will inspire faith in others. Don’t keep silent.

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
