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OPEN HEAVEN 30 MAY 2025 TODAY DEVOTIONAL

TOPIC: DON'T LET GO

MEMORISE:

And I say unto you, Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you.

Luke 11:9

READ: Luke 11:5-10

5 And he said unto them, Which of you shall have a friend, and shall go unto him at midnight, and say unto him, Friend, lend me three loaves;

6 For a friend of mine in his journey is come to me, and I have nothing to set before him?

7 And he from within shall answer and say, Trouble me not: the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give thee.

8 I say unto you, Though he will not rise and give him, because he is his friend, yet because of his

importunity he will rise and give him as many as he needeth.

9 And I say unto you, Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you.

10 For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.

RCCG OPEN HEAVEN 30 MAY 2025 TODAY MESSAGE

In Mark 10:46-52, Bartimaeus cried continually until Jesus attended to him. If Bartimaeus had not been persistent, he may not have gotten his miracle. In Genesis 32:24-28, when the angel said to Jacob, "Let me go," he replied, "I won't let you go until you bless me."

Beloved, hold on to God until you get your miracle. He said in Isaiah 62:6-7 that you should not let Him rest until He establishes you and makes you a praise in the earth.

Many people don't get their miracles because they give up too soon. However, people who know how to continually knock on heaven's doors always receive answers. Jesus told the parable of the widow who didn't stop demanding justice in Luke 18:2-5. She wouldn't let the judge rest until he attended to her matter. Although he didn't fear God or regard men, the widow's persistence pushed him to help her. In today's Bible reading, Jesus told another parable of a fellow who went to his friend's house at midnight to ask for bread to entertain a visitor. Jesus said that even though his friend might not want to respond to him because it was late, he would rise and give him as many loaves as he wanted because of his persistence.

Every problem you might experience in your life has an expiry date if you don't give up on God. If you continually knock, the door will eventually open. People who are fainthearted or give up easily cannot get anything significant from life. Such people let go, even when they are so close to their blessing.

People who don't let go are people of great determination. Some of them wrestle all night in prayer and continue knocking on heaven's door until they receive answers. Be determined; don't give up on your prayers until you receive answers like Daniel (Daniel 10:2-14), Jacob (Genesis 32:24-28), Elijah (1 Kings 18:42-45), and the widow in Jesus's parable (Luke 18:2-5).

Beloved, you can grow your strength by consuming God's word and waiting on Him in the place of prayer. Do not let the enemy cheat you by wearing you down at the edge of your breakthrough; hold on firmly to God's promises. Don't take "no" for an answer, you will eventually receive your miracle if you persist in your prayers like the woman in Matthew 15:21-28.

Do you want a blessing like Jacob or justice like the widow in Luke 18:2-5? Don't let go. Keep knocking and pushing until your answer comes.

KEY POINT

Those who keep knocking and asking will eventually receive their miracles.

OPEN HEAVEN DEVOTIONAL 30 MAY 2025 COMMENTARY

Memorise: Luke 11:9 (KJV)

This verse establishes the **threefold action plan for receiving miracles**: asking (petition), seeking (pursuit), and knocking (persistence).

Bible Reading: Luke 11:5-10 (KJV)

Jesus's parable of the midnight visitor illustrates **how bold persistence overcomes relational and temporal barriers** to secure divine provision.

Key Insights from Today's Open Heaven Devotional

1. Biblical Models of Persistent Faith

1. **Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52)**
 - *Obstacle*: Crowd's opposition
 - *Strategy*: Louder cries
 - *Result*: Instant healing
2. **Jacob (Genesis 32:26)**
 - *Obstacle*: Divine resistance
 - *Strategy*: "I will not let go"
 - *Result*: Covenant blessing
3. **Daniel (Daniel 10:12-13)**
 - *Obstacle*: 21-day spiritual warfare
 - *Strategy*: Continued fasting
 - *Result*: Angelic breakthrough

2. The Parabolic Blueprint for Breakthrough

- **Midnight Visitor (Luke 11:5-8)**
 1. *Audacity*: Asking at inconvenient time
 2. *Specificity*: Requesting “three loaves”
 3. *Persistence*: Refusing to take “no”
- **Widow’s Justice (Luke 18:1-8)**
 1. *Relentlessness*: “She keeps coming” (v.5)
 2. *Boldness*: Demanding from unjust judge
 3. *Result*: “Get her justice” (v.5)

3. Why Persistence Triumphs

1. **Tests Sincerity**
 - Casual seekers receive casual answers
 - “You will seek Me and find Me when you search with all your heart” (Jeremiah 29:13)
2. **Develops Spiritual Muscle**
 - Prayer endurance produces character (Romans 5:3-4)
3. **Overcomes Spiritual Resistance**
 - Daniel’s 21-day battle (Daniel 10:13)
 - Jesus’ 40-day wilderness victory (Matthew 4)

4. The Danger of Premature Surrender

- **Biblical Warnings:**
 1. *Elijah’s servant*: Stopped looking for rain too soon (1 Kings 18:43)
 2. *Israel at Kadesh*: Turned back when promised land was near (Numbers 14)
- **Modern Manifestations:**
 1. Abandoning prayer altars
 2. Accepting “no” from circumstances
 3. Losing hope at the “ninth hour”

5. Sustaining Persistent Faith

1. **Scripture Fuel**
 - “Eat the scroll” (Ezekiel 3:1-3)
 - Jesus defeated Satan with “It is written”
2. **Prophetic Reminders**
 - Recall God’s past faithfulness (1 Samuel 7:12)
3. **Corporate Support**
 - Prayer partners prevent weariness (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10)

Life Applications

For the Weary Intercessor:

- *Action*: Identify one “stuck prayer” → create a 21-day persistence plan

- *Encouragement:* The Syrophenician woman's "crumb" became a banquet (Mark 7:28-29)

For the Discouraged:

- *Visual Aid:* Make a "Wall of Promises" with Scripture verses
- *Warning:* Don't be like Saul who offered sacrifice prematurely (1 Samuel 13:8-14)

For Leaders:

- *Teaching Model:* Host "Night Watch" prayer sessions
- *Example:* Nehemiah prayed while working (Nehemiah 4:9)

Warning vs. Promise

- **Warning:** "The lazy man will not plow; therefore he shall beg" (Proverbs 20:4)
- **Promise:** "The effective prayer of a righteous man avails much" (James 5:16)

Conclusion: From Knocking to Overflow

1. Every "no" is a test of your "how much"
2. Breakthroughs come to those who outlast resistance
3. Your persistence today writes tomorrow's testimony

Prayer Response

"Father, make me a spiritual wrestler like Jacob, a relentless seeker like Bartimaeus, and a bold asker like the midnight visitor. Break every spirit of prayer fatigue in me. Let my persistence dismantle every obstacle to my miracle, in Jesus' name. Amen."

Final Charge

"Will your prayer life be remembered for its quitting points or its breakthrough moments?"
