OPEN HEAVEN 28 JUNE 2025 TODAY DEVOTIONAL

TOPIC: COMMANDING YOUR MIRACLE

MEMORISE:

His mother said unto the servants, Whatsoever He saith unto you, do it.
John 2:5

READ: John 2:1-12

- 1 And the third day there was a marriage in Cana of Galilee; and the mother of Jesus was there:
- 2 And both Jesus was called, and his disciples, to the marriage.
- 3 And when they wanted wine, the mother of Jesus saith unto him, They have no wine.
- 4 Jesus saith unto her, Woman, what have I to do with thee? mine hour is not yet come.
- 5 His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it.
- 6 And there were set there six waterpots of stone, after the manner of the purifying of the Jews, containing two or three firkins apiece.
- 7 Jesus saith unto them, Fill the waterpots with water. And they filled them up to the brim.

8 And he saith unto them, Draw out now, and bear unto the governor of the feast. And they bare it.
9 When the ruler of the feast had tasted the water that was made wine, and knew not whence it was: (but the servants which drew the water knew;) the governor of the feast called the bridegroom,
10 And saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now.

11 This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him.

12 After this he went down to Capernaum, he, and his mother, and his brethren, and his disciples: and they continued there not many days.

RCCG OPEN HEAVEN 28 JUNE 2025 TODAY MESSAGE

Today's Bible reading tells us the story of the wedding in Cana of Galilee. When wine finished at the wedding, Mary informed Jesus about it, expecting Him to provide a solution.

However, Jesus replied that His time had not yet come. Mary must have smiled and said to herself, "Son, your time will come tonight." She told the men confidently, "Do whatever He asks you to do," and before the end of the day, "not yet" became "now".

You can also command a miracle from God. You can pray in such a way that you will know that God has heard and your miracle is on the way. Jabez was a man who prayed such a prayer. For many years, he was labelled as a cause of pain and sorrow until he said, "Enough is enough." He called on God to turn his situation around, and He granted his request.

And Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying, Oh that thou wouldest bless me indeed, and enlarge my coast, and that thine hand might be with me, and that thou wouldest keep me from evil, that it may not grieve me! And God granted him that which he requested.

1 Chronicles 4:10

We don't know how long Jabez prayed for, but we know the result of his prayer: God turned his story around. In the name above every other name, whatever you have long waited for will come speedily.

To command your miracle, you must know how to engage in fervent prayers and be persistent with them. James said that the effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much (James 5:16). During a Holy Ghost Service at Redemption City, I waved my hands as I stood on the altar, and miracles started happening.

It is possible for some pastors who saw that happen to wonder, "Why can't I also wave and have miracles happen? I serve the same God this man serves; I also pray and fast regularly." However, they may not know that before that day, I had been praying that miracles should happen just at the wave of my hands for about fifteen years. Some of the things people see happening now in RCCG are the result of my persistence with God in the place of prayers.

Beloved, don't be tired of waiting on God. Command your miracles by remaining persistent in the place of prayer. As you pray, take heed to the Holy Spirit's instructions.

Obey them, and you will receive your miracle before long.

PRAYER POINT:

Father, please help me to remain persistent in the place of prayer, in Jesus's name.

OPEN HEAVEN DEVOTIONAL 28 JUNE 2025 COMMENTARY

The Dynamics of Commanding Your Miracle

This devotional reveals powerful principles about activating divine intervention through persistent faith and obedience. The account of Jesus's first miracle at Cana provides a template for how believers can position themselves for supernatural breakthroughs.

1. The Catalyst for Miracles: Divine Intercession

Mary's intervention demonstrates three crucial elements:

1. Recognition of Need

- She noticed the wine shortage (v.3)
- Spiritual sensitivity precedes miracles

2. Confident Appeal

- Brought the need to Jesus expectantly
- No formal prayer, just relational request

3. Persistent Faith

- Jesus's "not yet" didn't deter her (v.4)
- Prepared servants for obedience

2. The Process of Manifestation

The miracle required human cooperation with divine instruction:

1. Obedience Without Understanding

- Servants filled jars with water (v.7)
- No logical connection to wine production

2. Complete Compliance

- Filled “to the brim” (v.7)
- No half measures in faith

3. Immediate Execution

- “Draw out now” (v.8)
- Faith acts before seeing results

3. The Jabez Principle of Commanding Breakthroughs

1 Chronicles 4:10 reveals:

1. Audacious Request

- “Bless me indeed” – no small thinking
- “Enlarge my coast” – territorial increase

2. Comprehensive Coverage

- Divine presence (“hand with me”)
- Divine protection (“keep from evil”)

3. Guaranteed Outcome

- “God granted his request”
- Specific prayers get specific answers

The Power of Persistent Prayer

Building Miracle Capacity

Pastor Adeboye’s testimony shows:

1. Long-Term Investment

- 15 years praying for wave-of-hand miracles
- Spiritual authority is cultivated

2. Consistent Discipline

- Regular prayer and fasting
- Deeper communion with God

3. Obedience to Promptings

- Acting on Holy Spirit instructions
- Creating channels for miracles

Keys to Effective Miracle Prayers

1. Righteous Foundation (James 5:16)

- Clean hands and pure heart

2. Fervent Intensity

- “Effectual fervent prayer”
- Passionate spiritual engagement

3. Expectant Faith

- Believing before seeing (Mark 11:24)
- Acting in anticipation

Practical Steps to Command Your Miracle

1. Identify Your Need Specifically

- Wine shortage at Cana
- Jabez's fourfold request
- Avoid vague prayers

2. Position Yourself in Obedience

- Mary's instruction to servants
- Fill your jars completely
- Prepare for manifestation

3. Persist Beyond "Not Yet"

- Continue praying like the widow (Luke 18:1-8)
- Build spiritual capacity through consistency
- Don't abandon your prayer project

4. Activate Through Declaration

- Speak to your mountain (Mark 11:23)
- Command your breakthrough
- Release your faith verbally

Prayer for Miracle Activation

“Father of miracles, I come before You today with specific needs just as Mary and Jabez did. Give me courage to persist beyond “not yet” moments. Fill me with obedient faith to follow Your instructions completely. Let my prayers shift atmospheres and command breakthroughs. As I wait on You, renew my strength and assurance that my miracle is on the way. In Jesus’ mighty name, Amen.”

Living in Expectation of Miracles

1. Maintain Spiritual Sensitivity

- Recognize divine moments

2. Develop Prayer Stamina

- Build your miracle account daily

3. Obey Promptly

- When God says “fill the jars,” act immediately

4. Testify of Breakthroughs

- Share what God has done
- Encourage others’ faith

Key Takeaways:
