TOPIC: AVOIDING TEMPTATION

MEMORISE:

Abstain from all appearance of evil.

1 Thessalonians 5:22

READ: James 1:12-16

¹² Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him.

¹³ Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man:

¹⁴ But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed.

¹⁵ Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.

¹⁶ Do not err, my beloved brethren.

RCCG OPEN HEAVENS 30 JULY 2026 TODAY MESSAGE

All human beings will face temptations at different points in their lives. Even the Lord Jesus Christ was tempted in all points while he was on the earth (Hebrews 4:15). If the devil could tempt Jesus, then no one is above temptation. Despite this, however, certain temptations can be avoided.

James 1:13-15 says, "Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man: But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death." This means that if there is any lust in your life, you must confront and overcome it; otherwise, it can be used to draw you into sin, and sin brings death. To choose life, you must mortify the works of the flesh by the help of the Holy Spirit (Colossians 3:5).

However, even as you're mortifying your flesh through the help of the Holy Spirit, you must avoid people, places, and things that may tempt you. For example, if a man knows that he struggles to be faithful with money, he should not accept responsibilities that would put him in charge of other people's money until he has successfully mortified the lust for money through the help of the Holy Spirit.

Beloved, temptation is like a bird; it can fly over your head, and you may be unable to stop it from doing so. However, you can prevent it from building a nest on your head. If you let it build a nest on your head, then it is only a matter of time before your head is filled with its poop.

This is why it is better to walk away from situations or things that can tempt you, because when you give in to temptation, you might soon realise that it has taken over your life. At a time when some pastors under my watch had motorcycles, I forbade them from carrying ladies on their bikes. This is because the close physical contact that occurs during such motorcycle rides might sow a seed in both of their hearts that may germinate into something dangerous in the future.

Today's memory verse instructs us to flee every appearance of evil. Child of God, immediately you sense any form of temptation around you, flee!

Flee every appearance of evil!

OPEN HEAVENS DEVOTIONAL 30 JULY 2026 COMMENTARY

MEMORISE: 1 Thessalonians 5:22

Abstain from all appearance of evil.

This verse is God's command for proactive holiness.

BIBLE READING: James 1:12-16

This passage reveals the progression of temptation into sin and death. It starts with lust (inner desire), then enticement (external pull), then conception (agreement with the temptation), then sin (the act), and finally death (the consequence).

Temptation Is Universal: Even Jesus Was Tempted

All human beings will face temptations at different points in their lives. Even the Lord Jesus Christ was tempted in all points while he was on the earth (Hebrews 4:15). If the devil could tempt Jesus, then no one is above temptation. Despite this, however, certain temptations can be avoided.

Hebrews 4:15 *For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin.*

Who Was Tempted	What It Means for You
Jesus Himself	No one is above temptation
The Son of God	The devil will certainly tempt you
Yet He did not sin	You can also overcome, by His grace

Despite this, however, certain temptations can be avoided.

Not all temptations come to you unsolicited. Some you walk into. Some you create. Some you could have avoided by making different choices. You cannot stop the bird of temptation from flying over your head, but you can stop it from building a nest.

The Progression of Temptation (James 1:13-15)

James 1:13-15 says, "Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man: But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death."

Stage	Description	What You Can Do
Lust	Inner desire, craving, weakness	Confront and mortify it
Enticement	External pull toward the desire	Flee before it catches you
Conception	You agree with the temptation in your mind	Say "no" immediately
Sin	The act of disobedience	Repent quickly
Death	Spiritual and physical consequences	Avoid reaching this stage

This means that if there is any lust in your life, you must confront and overcome it; otherwise, it can be used to draw you into sin, and sin brings death.

Lust (Inner Weakness)	Must Be
Lust for money	Confronted and mortified
Lust for sex	Confronted and mortified
Lust for power	Confronted and mortified
Lust for approval	Confronted and mortified

To choose life, you must mortify the works of the flesh by the help of the Holy Spirit (Colossians 3:5).

Colossians 3:5 "Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry."

Mortify Means	You Cannot Do It Alone
Put to death, kill, starve	You need the Holy Spirit's help
Refuse to feed the lust	Pray for strength to overcome
Cut off the source	Walk in the Spirit, not in the flesh

The Bird and the Nest: Don't Let Temptation Settle

Beloved, temptation is like a bird; it can fly over your head, and you may be unable to stop it from doing so. However, you can prevent it from building a nest on your head. If you let it build a nest on your head, then it is only a matter of time before your head is filled with its poop.

The Bird (Temptation)

The Nest (Habitual Sin)

Flies over your head??you cannot stop every temptation from coming	You can prevent it from building a nest
A passing thought, a fleeting image, an external suggestion	Dwelling on it, entertaining it, feeding it
Not sin	Sin begins when you let it land and stay

??If you let it build a nest on your head, then it is only a matter of time before your head is filled with its poop.?

Letting Temptation Nest	The Result
Entertaining the thought	The thought grows stronger
Going back to the temptation	The nest gets bigger
Refusing to flee	Soon you are covered in the filth of sin

Do not let the bird land. Do not feed it. Do not build it a nest. Shoo it away immediately.

Practical Steps: Avoid People, Places, and Things That Tempt You

??However, even as you??re mortifying your flesh through the help of the Holy Spirit, you must avoid people, places, and things that may tempt you.?

What to Avoid	Why
People who lead you into sin	Evil communications corrupt good manners
Places where temptation is strong	You cannot walk through fire and not be burned
Things that trigger your lust	If it causes you to sin, cut it off (Matthew 5:29-30)

If You Struggle With?!	Avoid?!
Lust for money	Handling cash, managing finances
Lust for sex	Being alone with the opposite sex, watching inappropriate content
Lust for power	Positions that give you authority over others before you are ready
Lust for approval	Situations where you are tempted to compromise for acceptance

The Motorcycle Rule: Preventing Temptation Before It Starts

At a time when some pastors under my watch had motorcycles, I forbade them from carrying ladies on their bikes. This is because the close physical contact that occurs during such motorcycle rides might sow a seed in both of their hearts that may germinate into something dangerous in the future.

The Rule	The Wisdom Behind It
No ladies on pastors motorcycles	Close physical contact creates opportunity for temptation
Prevention is better than cure	Stop the seed before it germinates
Flee the appearance of evil	Do not put yourself in a situation that <i>looks</i> wrong

Daddy Adeboye did not wait until a pastor fell into sexual sin. He prevented the situation that could lead to it. That is wisdom. That is the application of 1 Thessalonians 5:22.

Flee, Don't Fight, When Temptation Comes

Today's memory verse instructs us to flee every appearance of evil. Child of God, immediately you sense any form of temptation around you, flee!

What the Bible Says	What It Means
Flee fornication (1 Corinthians 6:18)	Run. Do not walk. Do not negotiate.
Flee idolatry (1 Corinthians 10:14)	Get away from anything that takes God's place
Flee youthful lusts (2 Timothy 2:22)	Do not try to be strong; be smart and run

Flee, don't fight.

Fighting Temptation	Fleeing Temptation
Standing close to the fire	Running away from the fire
Trying to prove how strong you are	Admitting your weakness and running to safety
Joseph fled from Potiphar's wife	Samson stayed and fell

Joseph did not stand and argue with Potiphar's wife. He did not try to reason with her. He *fled*. He ran out of the house, leaving his garment behind. That is the model.

How to Avoid Temptation and Flee Evil (Practical Steps)

Based on Daddy Adeboye's teaching and Scripture, here is how to keep the bird from building a nest:

1. Identify Your Areas of Weakness

Be honest. Where are you most vulnerable? What lust is still alive in you? Money? Sex? Power? Approval? Food? Write it down. Acknowledge it.

2. Mortify the Flesh Through the Holy Spirit

Do not try to kill your lust through willpower alone. Pray. Fast. Walk in the Spirit. Ask the Holy Spirit to strengthen you. You cannot do it alone.

3. Avoid People, Places, and Things That Trigger You

If a certain friend leads you into sin, distance yourself. If a certain place tempts you, do not go there. If a certain website, show, or app triggers lust, delete it, block it, remove it.

4. Create Preventative Rules for Yourself

Like Daddy Adeboye's motorcycle rule, create your own boundaries:

- No being alone with the opposite sex in a closed room
- No handling money if you struggle with greed
- No social media scrolling late at night if it leads to lust

5. Flee Immediately When Temptation Comes

Do not pause. Do not reason. Do not negotiate. Do not see how close you can get without sinning. Flee. Run. Get away.

Warning: The Bird Will Poop If You Let It Nest

Daddy Adeboye's devotional carries an urgent warning: you cannot stop every temptation from flying over your head. But you can stop it from landing.

If You Let the Bird Land

You are in danger

The nest gets bigger

Soon, your head is full of filth

If You Let It Build a Nest

You are in sin

The poop (consequences) will come

You will be covered in shame and regret

• If you let it build a nest on your head, then it is only a matter of time before your head is filled with its poop. •

Do not let the bird land. Shoo it away. Flee. Run. Do not give temptation a place to stay.

Conclusion: Your Prayer for Deliverance from Temptation

Daddy Adeboye closes with a call to flee every appearance of evil. Do not be proud. Do not be foolish. Run to safety.

Pray this:

Lord Jesus, I thank You that You were tempted in all points yet without sin. You know what it is to face temptation. I confess that I have weaknesses—areas where lust is still alive in me. I have not wanted to admit them. Today, I identify them. I bring them to You. Help me to mortify the works of my flesh by the power of Your Holy Spirit. Give me wisdom to avoid people, places, and things that tempt me. Give me the courage to flee—not to fight, not to negotiate, not to see how close I can get—but to run. I will not let the bird of temptation build a nest on my head. I will not give it a place to land. I will flee every appearance of evil. In Jesus' mighty name. Amen.

Action Steps:

1. **The Weakness Audit:** Write down your top three areas of temptation. Be honest. Do not hide them. Acknowledge them before God.
2. **The Boundary Setting:** For each weakness, create a specific rule to prevent temptation. (Example: "If I struggle with lust online, I will install accountability software and not use my phone after 10 PM.")
3. **The Flight Plan:** The next time you feel tempted, do not pause. Do not argue. Flee immediately. Leave the room. Turn off the screen. End the conversation. Run.

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
