TOPIC: HE WHO THINKS HE STANDS I

MEMORISE

Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness.
Luke 11:35

READ: 1 Timothy 4:13-16

¹³ Till I come, give attendance to reading, to exhortation, to doctrine.

¹⁴ Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery.

¹⁵ Meditate upon these things; give thyself wholly to them; that thy profiting may appear to all.

¹⁶ Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.

RCCG OPEN HEAVENS 3 AUGUST 2026 TODAY MESSAGE

1 Corinthians 10:12 says that any man who thinks he is standing should take heed, or else he will fall.

That tells us that a person can be standing today and fall tomorrow if he or she is not careful.

Overconfidence can make someone who has been standing in the Lord for a long time fall. In my 53-year walk with God, I have witnessed many people fall due to overconfidence. They believe that because they have been standing in the Lord for a long time, they are now above certain temptations, and typically, such a mindset would make them careless.

As a Christian, the devil is watching you at all times; if you become careless in any area, he can use that to bring you down. I have heard some men of God boast that they can be in the same room with a naked woman, and nothing will happen. My question is, why is a man of God in a room with a naked woman that isn't his wife in the first place? If a man of God puts himself in such a position, he is already on the verge of falling. I always tell my children that under no circumstances should a man have a female secretary or personal assistant. This is because the man will spend long hours working with the fellow, possibly into the night at times. If such a man places so much confidence in his ability to resist temptation, it may eventually become his undoing.

Overconfidence has also led many people to ignore the basics of their salvation. For example, some ministers of God believe that some Bible study meetings are now beneath them because of their anointing. Some others believe that they don't need to listen or take notes when someone they consider to be below them in hierarchy is preaching. Some even hold other meetings during praise and worship sessions. Actions like these show overconfidence and often lead to a fall.

Beloved, never allow yourself to become overconfident in your walk with God. Do not let any exploits that you may have done in the past distract you from following the basics of your salvation. You can never outgrow walking circumspectly, studying the word of God, fasting, and fellowshiping with other believers. No matter your level of growth in the Lord, you can't outgrow these things. I pray that the Almighty God will keep you standing in Him unto the end of your race here on earth, in Jesus' name.

KEY POINT

No one can ever outgrow the basics of salvation.

OPEN HEAVENS DEVOTIONAL 3 AUGUST 2026 COMMENTARY

MEMORISE: Luke 11:35

“Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness.”

This is a sobering warning: what you think is spiritual strength and insight can become a source of blindness if you become careless. Overconfidence dims your light and exposes you to a fall.

BIBLE READING: 1 Timothy 4:13-16

Paul exhorts Timothy to give attention to reading, exhortation, and doctrine. He warns him to “take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt both save thyself, and them that hear thee.” This passage reminds us that no one outgrows the basics—study, prayer, and self-examination are lifelong disciplines for every believer.

The Danger of Overconfidence: Standing Today, Fallen Tomorrow

“1 Corinthians 10:12 says that any man who thinks he is standing should take heed, or else he will fall. That tells us that a person can be standing today and fall tomorrow if he or she is not careful.”

The False Assumption	The Reality
“I have stood for years, so I am safe.”	Standing today does not guarantee standing tomorrow
“I am above temptation.”	No one is above temptation
“I can handle it.”	Overconfidence leads to carelessness

What Overconfidence Looks Like	The Result
“I have been a Christian for decades.”	You stop being vigilant
“I have overcome so much.”	You think you cannot fall
“I know my limits.”	You test those limits unnecessarily

The Devil Watches for Carelessness

“As a Christian, the devil is watching you at all times; if you become careless in any area, he can use that to bring you down.”

The Devil's Strategy

He watches for openings

He waits for overconfidence

He attacks where you are relaxed

Your Vulnerability

Carelessness creates openings

Pride goes before a fall

Your guard is down

“I have heard some men of God boast that they can be in the same room with a naked woman, and nothing will happen. My question is, why is a man of God in a room with a naked woman that isn't his wife in the first place?”

Boastful Confidence

“I can resist anything.” Why are you in that situation at all?

“I am strong enough.” Why test your strength unnecessarily?

“Nothing will happen.” Why put yourself in a position to fall?

The Wise Question

“If a man of God puts himself in such a position, he is already on the verge of falling.”

You do not need to be in the fire to prove you can survive it. Stay away from the fire altogether.

The Principle: Never Put Yourself in a Position to Fall

“I always tell my children that under no circumstances should a man have a female secretary or personal assistant. This is because the man will spend long hours working with the fellow, possibly into the night at times. If such a man places so much confidence in his ability to resist temptation, it may eventually become his undoing.”

The Principle

Avoid the appearance of evil

Flee temptation, do not flirt with it

Do not rely on your own strength

The Application

Do not put yourself in compromising situations

Create boundaries that protect you

Recognize your weakness and guard it

Overconfidence Leads to Neglecting the Basics

Neglecting the Basics

Bible study

Prayer

Fellowship

The Dangerous Mindset

“I already know enough.”

“I have authority; I don’t need to plead.”

“I am above this level.”

Some others believe that they don’t need to listen or take notes when someone they consider to be below them in hierarchy is preaching.

Prideful Response

“I have nothing to learn from them.” “God can speak through anyone.”

“I am the teacher, not the student.” “I am always a student of the Word.”

“This is beneath me.”

Wise Response

“No discipline is beneath a disciple.”

What They Miss

The presence of God

The opportunity to worship

The fellowship of believers

The Consequence

They lose sensitivity to the Spirit

Their hearts grow cold

They isolate themselves

No One Outgrows the Basics

Beloved, never allow yourself to become overconfident in your walk with God. Do not let any exploits that you may have done in the past distract you from following the basics of your salvation.

You Can Never Outgrow

Walking circumspectly

Studying the Word

Fasting

Fellowshipping with believers

Why

The enemy is always watching

You need fresh strength daily

The flesh must be subdued continually

You need accountability and encouragement

No matter your level of growth in the Lord, you can’t outgrow these things.

How to Guard Against Overconfidence (Practical Steps)

Based on Daddy Adeboye’s teaching, here is how to keep your light from becoming darkness:

1. Recognize Your Weakness

Do not boast in your strength. Paul said, *“When I am weak, then am I strong”* (2 Corinthians 12:10). Acknowledge that without God’s grace, you can fall at any moment.

2. Stay Away from Tempting Situations

Do not test your ability to resist. Stay out of compromising positions. If you struggle with lust, do not be alone with the opposite sex. If you struggle with greed, do not handle money without accountability.

3. Never Neglect the Basics

Keep studying the Word. Keep praying. Keep fasting. Keep fellowshiping. These are not for beginners only—they are for every believer, at every level.

4. Receive Correction and Instruction

Listen to those who are ahead of you and even those who are behind you. God can speak through anyone. Do not let pride close your ears.

5. Stay Humble and Watchful

“Take heed that the light which is in thee be not darkness.”

Regularly examine yourself. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you any area where you have become careless or overconfident. Stay humble. Stay watchful.

Warning: Overconfidence Is a Setup for a Fall

Daddy Adeboye’s devotional carries an urgent warning: your past victories do not guarantee future success. You are one careless moment away from a fall.

What You Think	The Reality
“I am secure”	You are secure only in humility and vigilance
“I have arrived”	You have not yet arrived
“I can handle it”	You cannot handle it in your own strength

Conclusion: Your Prayer for Humility and Watchfulness

Daddy Adeboye closes with a prayer that God will keep you standing until the end. Do not let overconfidence be your undoing.

Pray this:

“Lord Jesus, I thank You for every victory You have given me. But I confess that I have become careless in some areas. I have placed too much confidence in my own strength. I

have neglected the basics. I have put myself in positions I should have avoided. Forgive me, Lord. Restore the light in me. Help me to walk circumspectly. Help me to never outgrow prayer, Your Word, fasting, and fellowship. Keep me humble. Keep me watchful. And when the enemy comes, let me not fall. In Jesus's mighty name.â•

Action Steps:

1. **The Carelessness Audit:** Ask God to reveal any area where you have become overconfident or careless. Write it down. Take immediate steps to correct it.
2. **The Basic Check:** Evaluate your commitment to prayer, Bible study, fasting, and fellowship. Have you neglected any of these? Restore them this week.
3. **The "Why Am I Here?" Test:** Before entering any questionable situation, ask: *Why am I here? Is this a place where I could fall?* If so, leave immediately.

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
