TOPIC: NOT BY MIGHT

MEMORISE

Then he answered and spake unto me, saying, This is the word of the LORD unto Zerubbabel, saying, Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts.

Zechariah 4:6

READ: Ecclesiastes 9:11-12

¹¹ I returned, and saw under the sun, that the race is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, neither yet bread to the wise, nor yet riches to men of understanding, nor yet favour to men of skill; but time and chance happeneth to them all.

¹² For man also knoweth not his time: as the fishes that are taken in an evil net, and as the birds that are caught in the snare; so are the sons of men snared in an evil time, when it falleth suddenly upon them.

RCCG OPEN HEAVENS 6 AUGUST 2026 TODAY MESSAGE

What a person will become during his or her sojourn on earth will not depend solely on the fellow's efforts. African elders have an adage that says, Hustling and bustling does not translate to wealth. This is true because, for instance, dockworkers who offload cargo from a ship from sunrise to sunset typically would earn only a fraction of what the Chief Executive Officer of a wharf, who sits in an air conditioned office, sipping tea and merely signing documents, would earn. At the end of a month, the fellow's salary might even be more than what a hefty, hardworking dockworker will earn in a whole year!

Today's Bible reading makes it clear that the fact that a fellow can run swiftly does not mean that he or she will win a race, and the fact that a fellow is strong does not mean that he or she will defeat an enemy. The passage goes on to say that bread is not to the wise, neither are riches to men of understanding. This means that a fellow's advanced level of education alone will not determine how wealthy he or she will become.

I recall that I was in Redemption Camp (now Redemption City) sometime between 1983 and 1984, spending time alone with God, and crying to Him. I said, "God, I'm not asking for clothes, a car, or a house. I was minding my business as a lecturer at the university when You asked me to come and serve You. I agreed, and I really want to serve You; however, I need power to do Your work. I don't want to be an ordinary pastor; I want to excel." In desperation, I added, "God, it is either You empower me, or You take me home." My prayer touched Him, and that night, the entire campground shook due to an earthquake that sent tremors as far as Jebu Ode, a town several kilometres away. The Lord visited me and empowered me with His anointing to excel.

Beloved, you need God's anointing to excel. It is God who gives power to get wealth (Deuteronomy 8:18), it is only His anointing that can teach you everything you need to know (1 John 2:27), and it is only through Him that you can do all things (Philippians 4:13). This is why you must cry out to God to anoint you just as I did several years ago. I pray that my Daddy will empower you to excel, in Jesus' name.

MEMORISE: Zechariah 4:6

“Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts.”

Human effort, education, and natural strength are not enough to excel in God’s kingdom or in life. What you need is the Spirit of God—His anointing—to do what your own efforts cannot accomplish.

BIBLE READING: Ecclesiastes 9:11-12

This passage declares that the race is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, nor bread to the wise, nor riches to men of understanding, nor favor to men of skill—but time and chance happen to them all. Human effort alone does not guarantee success. Ultimately, God’s sovereign hand determines the outcome.

Hustling vs. The Anointing

“What a person will become during his or her sojourn on earth will not depend solely on the fellow’s efforts. African elders have an adage that says, ‘Hustling and bustling does not translate to wealth.’ This is true because, for instance, dockworkers who offload cargo from a ship from sunrise to sunset typically would earn only a fraction of what the Chief Executive Officer of a wharf, who sits in an air conditioned office, sipping tea and merely signing documents, would earn.”

Hard Work Alone

The dockworker works from sunrise to sunset
The dockworker sweats and strains
The dockworker earns a fraction

The Anointing

The CEO sits in an office and signs documents
The CEO works with ease
The CEO earns exponentially more

“At the end of a month, the fellow’s salary might even be more than what a hefty, hardworking dockworker will earn in a whole year!”

Human effort has its limits. The anointing gives you access, favor, and supernatural efficiency that hard work alone cannot produce.

The Race Is Not to the Swift (Ecclesiastes 9:11)

“Today’s Bible reading makes it clear that the fact that a fellow can run swiftly does not mean that he or she will win a race, and the fact that a fellow is strong does not mean that he or she will defeat an enemy.”

What Does Not Guarantee Success

Running swiftly (speed)

Being strong (natural ability)

Being wise (education, intelligence)

Having understanding (skill, strategy)

What Is Needed

Divine timing and favor

God's empowerment

The anointing that teaches

God's blessing and direction

A PhD

A strategic mind

Hard work and discipline

But Without the Anointing

You may still lack provision

You may still miss opportunities

Daddy Adeboye's Testimony: Crying Out for the Anointing

I recall that I was in Redemption Camp (now Redemption City) sometime between 1983 and 1984, spending time alone with God, and crying to Him. What Daddy Adeboye Did Not Ask

Material things (clothes, car, house)

Comfort or ease

Ordinary provision

What He Did Ask

Power to do God's work

Excellence in ministry

Extraordinary empowerment

His Prayer

"Empower me or take me home"

He prayed with desperation

He wanted to excel

The Response

God visited him that night

The ground shook

He received the anointing

You Need the Anointing to Excel

“Beloved, you need God’s anointing to excel. It is God who gives power to get wealth (Deuteronomy 8:18), it is only His anointing that can teach you everything you need to know (1 John 2:27), and it is only through Him that you can do all things (Philippians 4:13).”

What the Anointing Does	Scripture
Gives power to get wealth	Deuteronomy 8:18
Teaches you all things	1 John 2:27
Empowers you to do all things	Philippians 4:13

“This is why you must cry out to God to anoint you just as I did several years ago.”

What You Need	What You Must Do
The anointing to excel	Cry out to God in desperation
Power to do His work	Seek Him with urgency
Wisdom and favor	Ask Him to empower you

How to Cry Out for the Anointing (Practical Steps)

Based on Daddy Adeboye’s testimony, here is how to position yourself for God’s empowering anointing:

1. Be Desperate for God, Not Just for Things

Daddy Adeboye did not ask for material things. He asked for power to do God’s work. Examine your heart: are you asking for things to consume on your own pleasure, or for empowerment to serve God?

2. Spend Time Alone with God

Daddy Adeboye was at Redemption Camp, alone with God. Make time to separate yourself from distractions and seek His face. Prayer retreats, fasting, and extended times of seeking God position you for His anointing.

3. Pray with Desperation

His prayer was not casual: *“Empower me or take me home.”* Desperation touches God. Do not pray polite, comfortable prayers when you need His power. Cry out.

4. Ask for the Right Thing

Do not ask for fame, money, or recognition. Ask for the anointing to excel in His purpose. Seek His kingdom, and He will add everything else.

5. Expect a Response

Daddy Adeboye expected God to answer. He prayed until something happened. Do not pray and forget. Expect God to visit you. Expect the ground to shake in your life.

Warning: Without the Anointing, You Will Be Ordinary

Daddy Adeboye's devotional carries an urgent encouragement: you can work hard and still not excel if you lack the anointing.

With the Anointing	Without the Anointing
You do what others cannot	You struggle like everyone else
You have supernatural efficiency	You rely solely on natural effort
You excel and make an impact	You remain ordinary

Conclusion: Your Prayer for the Anointing

Daddy Adeboye closes with a prayer that God will empower you to excel. Cry out to Him today for His anointing.

Pray this:

Lord Jesus, I come before You like Daddy Adeboye did. I am not asking for clothes, a car, or a house. I am asking for power to do Your work. I don't want to be ordinary. I don't want to struggle all my life. I want to excel. I want to run my race with speed. I want to defeat my enemies. I want to be fruitful. Lord, empower me. Anoint me. Teach me by Your Spirit. Give me power to get wealth—not for myself, but for Your kingdom. I am desperate for You. Either empower me, Lord, or take me home. Visit me. Let the ground shake in my life. In Jesus's mighty name. Amen

Action Steps:

1. **The Desperation Check:** Are you desperate for God's anointing, or are you just comfortable with your current level of success? If you are not desperate, ask God to give you a holy desperation.
2. **The Prayer Retreat:** Set aside time this week to be alone with God. Even if it is just a few hours, separate yourself from distractions. Cry out to Him for empowerment.
3. **The Anointing Audit:** Where have you been relying solely on your own effort? Identify one area and ask God for His Spirit to empower you there.

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
