OPEN HEAVEN 20 MARCH 2025 DEVOTIONAL

TOPIC: FROM DOG TO CHILD II

MEMORISE:

But go ye and learn what that meaneth, I will have mercy, and not sacrifice: for I am not come to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance. Matthew 9:13

READ: 1 Timothy 1:11-17

11 According to the glorious gospel of the blessed God, which was committed to my trust.

12 And I thank Christ Jesus our Lord, who hath enabled me, for that he counted me faithful, putting me into the ministry;

13 Who was before a blasphemer, and a persecutor, and injurious: but I obtained mercy, because I did it ignorantly in unbelief.

14 And the grace of our Lord was exceeding abundant with faith and love which is in Christ Jesus.

15 This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief.

16 Howbeit for this cause I obtained mercy, that in me first Jesus Christ might shew forth all

longsuffering, for a pattern to them which should hereafter believe on him to life everlasting. 17 Now unto the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

RCCG OPEN HEAVEN 20 MARCH 2025 TODAY MESSAGE

Yesterday, I established that God considers sinners and backsliders as dogs (Matthew 15:21, 2 Peter 2:22), and today, I will conclude the discussion on God's willingness to change them to children.

Before I became born again, and while I was still single, I had so many girlfriends. Years later, after I had gotten married and given my life to Christ, I became a lecturer at the University of Ilorin. After a while, one of my former girlfriends, who had also gotten married, relocated to llorin with her husband.

She had a child who was born lame, and somebody told her that there was a pastor who could pray for her child, and the child would begin to walk. When she came to the church, she asked to see the pastor. She was ushered into my office, and when she opened the door and saw me, we greeted ourselves as old flames would. Finally, she said, "I want to see the pastor." I said, "Yes, how can I help you?" She replied, "I said I want to see the pastor." I said, "I am the pastor." She responded, "You? You will pray, and God will answer?" We prayed, and the child began to walk.

The Bible says that if any man is in Christ, he is a new creature (2 Corinthians 5:17). The greatest miracle is the salvation of souls. If you are not yet born again, no matter now grave your sins are, God can save you too as He saved me.

Before Saul encountered Jesus, he was a persecutor of Christians. However, after his encounter, he became a great asset to the Kingdom (1 Timothy 1:12-14). God converted cities through him, and a whole continent heard of Jesus through his ministry (Acts 19:26).

There is no limit to what God can do in you, with you, and through you because when He transforms a man, He does it completely. As a son, you will have access to divine privileges. You will have the right to call God your Father, and you will partake of His inheritance.

Paul understood what it meant to be a new creature, and as God's child, he exercised his divine rights and authority. From a former dog, special miracles happened, and many people became transformed. If you are not yet born again, God wants to give you a new identity and make you His beloved child. Surrender to Him now and watch Him make your life a wonder to many (Psalm 71:7).

BIBLE IN ONE YEAR

Judges 20-21

OPEN HEAVEN DEVOTIONAL 20 MARCH 2025 COMMENTARY

Today's devotional is a powerful testimony of God's transformative grace and His ability to take sinners and backsliders and make them into new creations in Christ.

It emphasizes the completeness of God's work in a person's life when they surrender to Him. Here is breakdown:

1. MEMORISE: Matthew 9:13

Matthew 9:13 highlights the heart of Jesus' mission: to seek and save the lost. It reminds us that God's priority is not religious rituals or outward appearances but mercy and transformation. This verse sets the foundation for the devotional, emphasizing that God's grace is available to all, no matter how sinful or broken they may be.

2. BIBLE READING: 1 Timothy 1:11-17

In this passage, Paul reflects on his own transformation from a persecutor of Christians to an apostle of Christ. He describes himself as the "chief of sinners" (1 Timothy 1:15) but acknowledges that God's grace was poured out abundantly on him. This passage underscores several key truths:

- **Transformation is Possible:** Paul's life is a testament to the complete change that God can bring about in a person.
- God's Purpose in Salvation: Paul's transformation was not just for his benefit but to serve as an example of God's patience and love for others.

This passage reinforces the devotional's message that God can take even the worst sinners and use them mightily for His kingdom.

3. The Testimony of Transformation

The devotional includes a personal testimony of Daddy Adeboye, who shares how God transformed his life from a life of sin to a life of service. The story of his former girlfriend coming to him for prayer, not realizing he had become a pastor, is a powerful illustration of God's ability to change lives completely. The healing of her child is not just a physical miracle but also a spiritual sign of God's power working through a transformed life.

This testimony highlights:

• The Power of a New Identity in Christ: The author's transformation from a life of sin to a life of ministry shows that in Christ, we are truly new creations (2 Corinthians 5:17).

• God's Use of Transformed Lives: Daddy Adeboye's past did not disqualify him from being used by God; instead, it became a platform for God's glory.

4. The Example of Paul (Saul)

Today's devotional draws a parallel between the author's transformation and that of the Apostle Paul. Paul's life is one of the most dramatic examples of God's grace in the Bible. From being a persecutor of the church to becoming one of its greatest leaders, Paul's story demonstrates:

- The Purpose of Transformation: Paul's life was not just changed for his sake but for the sake of the gospel. His ministry impacted cities and continents, showing that God's transformation always has a greater purpose.

5. The Privileges of Being God's Child

- **Transformation is Complete:** When God changes a person, He does it thoroughly, giving them a new identity and purpose.
- Your Life Can Be a Testimony: God's work in your life can become a powerful testimony to others.

- **Encouragement:** It reminds us of the power of God's grace in our own lives and encourages us to celebrate the transformations we see in others.
