TOPIC: WATER BAPTISM

OPENING PRAYER:

Father, help me to know the significance of water baptism in Jesus's name.

PREVIOUS KNOWLEDGE:

The teacher should allow the assistant teacher to review the lesson for the previous week.

BIBLE READING

BIBLE PASSAGE: Matthew 28:19-20

19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

MEMORY VERSE:

“Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls.” Acts 2:41.

LESSON INTRODUCTION

The word “baptise” comes from the Greek word “baptizo,” which means “to immerse or dip under water.” Water baptism is a public declaration of our promise not to walk in sin anymore. It also connects us to the body of Christ. Jesus Himself was baptised by immersion (Matthew 3:16).

TEACHER’S DIARY

LESSON AIM: To understand the significance of water baptism to every believer.

TEACHING OBJECTIVES: Through this lesson, students should be able to:

- a. Define the word “baptise.”
- b. Describe water baptism and its significance.
- c. Mention things to note on water baptism.

TEACHING PLAN: To achieve the above-stated objectives, the teacher should:

- a. Allow the students to recite the memory verse, read the Bible passage, contribute to the discussion, and do class activities and assignments.
- b. Allow the Assistant Teacher to see to the well-being of the class, and mark attendance and assignment.
- c. Teach the lesson outline, summarise, conclude, evaluate the lesson and give assignments.

TEXT REVIEW: Matthew 28:19-20

A. Our Lord Jesus Christ, just before His ascension, gave three commands to his disciples, and by extension to every believer that they should:

- i. Go and make disciples of all nations. Vs. 19a
- ii. Baptise them. Vs. 19b

iii. Teach them toâ?!. Vs. 20a

B. He promised to be with the disciples always, evenâ?!. Vs. 20b

TEACHING METHOD: The Lecture Method.

TIME MANAGEMENT: The teacher should apply the two-lesson outline teaching time.

LESSON OUTLINE 1: THE DESCRIPTION

A. Description:

1. Water baptism is a Christian rite representing a public profession of repentance and faith in Jesus Christ.
2. It symbolises identification with Christâ??s death, burial, and resurrection, signifying commitment to God.
 - i. Being submerged in the water represents dying to oneâ??s old life.
 - ii. Rising from the water symbolises the new life in Christ.
3. The act is a command from Jesus and an act of obedience for believers (Matthew 28:19-20).
4. Water baptism is a practical demonstration of our spiritual reality and a personal testimony that we have passed from the old life of sin to the new life of righteousness in Christ through faith (Colossians 2:11-12).

B. Requirements:

1. The main requirements for water baptism are a personal faith in Jesus Christ as your Lord and Saviour and repentance from sin.
2. You must also have heard the Gospel message and be able to make a public confession of faith that you have accepted Christ as your Lord and Saviour.
3. The correct way to get baptised is that prayer is offered and the person is lowered under the water before rising to signify a new beginning in the name of â??The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit,â?• which is what Jesus commanded us (Matthew 28:19).
4. As soon as a person believes in Christ, he can be, and is encouraged to be baptised (Acts 8:35-39; 10:45-48).

CLASS ACTIVITY 1:

Discuss how water baptism aids a real change in a believerâ??s life.

LESSON OUTLINE 2: THINGS TO NOTE

1. It is not the baptism that saves, but baptism is a response to the declaration of an inward, saving faith.
2. Those who have given their lives to Christ are encouraged to proclaim their faith publicly through water baptism. However, not all believers may have the opportunity to do so due to some uncontrollable factors like the â??thief on the crossâ?• (Luke 23:39-43).

3. Water baptism should be done in the name of “The Father, The Son, and The Holy Spirit” (Matthew 28:19).
4. Any believer in Christ who has been baptised by immersion should be welcomed and accepted by the Church of God, irrespective of denomination (Acts 2:41).
5. No one is ineligible for baptism due to past sins; in fact, baptism is a sign that you believe and have been cleansed from sin through faith in Christ.

CLASS ACTIVITY 2:

Is it biblical to undergo water baptism (by immersion) more than once? Discuss.
